

Implementation of Dr. Sarfaty's manual

The toolkit is approved through the American Academy of Family Physicians for 20 Evidenced-Based CME credits.

CME credit is available from the American Medical Association and the American Academy of Family Physicians for practice improvement activities. It has also been approved for 20 hours of Evidence-Based Credits through the New Jersey Academy of Family Physicians. Those are available to any practicing physician in the U.S.

Physicians would need to go online to the CME records portion and look for the New Jersey listing titled "How to Increase Colorectal Cancer" under the Enduring Material heading.

Once there, they would account for the number of hours/credit they earned.

If your participants are family physicians, this would be very easy and regular for them. Other PCP's will have to roll-over this credit to fit their specialty's requirements - either through the AMA or another organization that collects and monitors their CME.

- earning hours in this type of model requires self reporting of data - baseline and remeasurement- with a period of implementing an intervention of some kind (flow sheet to track cancer screening measures) and self reporting back to the organization providing the education hours.
